WET COMMITTEE 2024

PROJECTS

The water system to the village of ASULAU was officially opened on December 11th 2023 by Dr. Jose Ramos Horta, President of Timor-Leste. Unfortunately it was not possible for a WET member to attend the opening, however it was a real plus to have Jeremy Lee Breakfast Host ABC South West, interview President Ramos Horta and WET committee members Julie Kean and Geoff Spencer.

1,400 villagers, 214 households and 220 primary school students benefitted from this system. WET provided the water supply with the President pledging funds to construct a toilet block adjacent to the school. This project cost \$A26,000 and was funded by a grant of \$10,000 from Warrnambool East Rotary and a \$1,000 Ripple Effect Grant from Wannon Water. We are very grateful for these grants and the ongoing support of Warrnambool East Rotary. Remaining funds for this project came from donors, members and community supporters. Thank you for helping make it happen!

It was the first time ever that the village of Asulau, in a remote part of Timor- Leste, had been visited by a President. Some children in this area walk 16 kms a day to attend school, after first collecting the day's water supply for their family and the water source is often several kms from their homes. Providing clean water to villages like Asulau not only improves health and reduces disease, it also allows children to attend school, particularly female children who are predominantly the water fetchers.

PORT FAIRY TANKS

Warrnambool East Rotary has donated \$10,000 to WET to facilitate the deconstruction and redesign of a large water tank donated by Port Fairy Hospital. The plan is to re-roll this tank into three 50,000 litre tanks. The reconstruction would be undertaken in Timor-Leste by the Bakhita water team. Andy and Daryl have been instrumental in organising this donation, along with members of Warrnambool East and Port Fairy Rotary Clubs. They will lead the operation anticipated to begin in May 2024. Previously three similar tanks were sent from Moyne Health, with Andy Graham and Daryl Lewis travelling to Timor-Leste to teach the water team how to reassemble them. All three tanks have been successfully reconstructed and used in WET projects.

HATOBUILICO





Our 2024 project in Hatobuilico, a village which sits at an altitude of 2,400 metres above sea level on the shoulder of Mount Ramelau, the highest peak in Timor-Leste, sitting at 2.9 metres. Hatobuilico is 28kms from Maubisse, the nearest sizeable town accessible by road. The majority of people in the village are subsistence farmers: corn being a major crop. Tourism is increasing as Hatobuilico is one of the popular starting points to climb Mt Ramelau. Providing accommodation and guides for climbing the mountain is a developing part of the economy.

A group in the Blue Mountains NSW have formed a friendship link with Hatobuilico called Blue Mountains Together for Timor (BMT4T). They have been supporting the education, health and wellbeing particularly of women and children, for a number of years now.

Our project is still in its planning stage but will be based on a design similar to previous ones, utilising poly pipe, tanks and taps to bring water from a spring source to a number of tap stands in the village.
